

WDVA's Homeless Veterans Reintegration Project

HVRP is a proven, successful program that gets homeless veterans off the street and back to being productive members of society. WDVA provides HVRP-W services to Women Veterans in the Puget Sound Region of King, Pierce, Thurston, Kitsap, and Snohomish Counties. HVRP-Rural services are provided to Counties in Eastern Washington, Northern Idaho, Western Montana, and Northeastern Oregon.

The HVRP offers a structured, individually designed case management plan to assist veterans become employable and secure by providing, food, transportation, clothing, residential stability and employment support services.

Through outreach, assessments, and enrollment into program services, veterans are provided services and activities that will develop or increase job readiness.



Program Services include:

- ❖ Immediate needs – food, clothing and shelter;
- ❖ Outreach to homeless providers;
- ❖ Employability needs and skills assessment;
- ❖ Job readiness services, including transitional housing assistance, basic skills training, therapeutic work, résumé development and employment opportunity referrals; and
- ❖ 90, 180, and 270-day job retention follow-up.

Direct Client Services include:

- ❖ Shelter placement;
- ❖ Transitional and permanent housing placement assistance;
- ❖ Medical assistance including dental, optical, counseling referrals;
- ❖ Employment support services such as job-related equipment, clothing, transportation, food, child care and limited financial assistance;
- ❖ Training and remedial education, job preparation services, trade certification and licensing assistance;
- ❖ Referral for domestic abuse, readjustment & trauma counseling; and
- ❖ Claims preparation for VA benefits and entitlements.

Eligibility:

To be eligible for participation under HVRP, an individual must be homeless and a veteran as defined:

The term “*homeless or homeless individual*” includes persons:

- ❖ Who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence;
- ❖ Whose primary nighttime residence is either a supervised public or private shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations, or a temporary residence for individuals intended to be institutional; or
- ❖ Living in a private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.

The term “*veteran*” means a person who served in active duty military, naval or air service and who was discharged or released under other than dishonorable.
